

Before the Reading

- Talk about the Title Explore the Book
- Look at pictures and predict what will happen
- Look at unusual words and names
- Say whether fact or fiction

During the Reading

- 1. Read the book to your child
- 2. *Read* the book *together*
- 3. Your child *reads* the book *alone*
- *Remember not all steps may be
- appropriate at every reading.

After the Reading

Ask questions like

- * Did the story happen how we thought?
- * Did you think that was how the story would end?
- * What was your favourite part?
- * Which character was the most interesting?
- * Have you read a book like this before?



	Helpful Hints
8	Choose a calm and cosy place, free from distractions.
Ω	Pick a time when your child is not over tired, hungry or irritable.
Ð	Read regularly to your child and make reading something you enjoy together.
	 Talk about the books you share together and ask questions like "Did you like the story?" "Did you think that was how it would end?" "What was your favourite part?"
8	Relate the book to your child's own experiences – animals, places, incidents that are similar to the book. "Does that look like Grandma's house?"
(Talk about the pictures and the words, let them use the pictures to assist their reading.
	Praise successful efforts and keep the story flowing; wait until the end before correcting errors.
